














## Unit 3 Vocabulary

### Iroquois Confederacy

Term	Definition	Picture
<b>Alliance</b>	An agreement among a group of nations to support each other	
<b>Allies</b>	Groups or nations that fight together against a common enemy	
<b>Collective Identity</b>	The identity that a group of people share which contributes to a sense of belonging.	
<b>Confederacy</b>	A league or an alliance of a group of people	
<b>Consensus</b>	Agreement by everyone involved in a decision, achieved through a process of discussion in which everyone has a voice and works for the good of the whole group	

<b>Diversity</b>	Difference among people in terms of culture, language, background, talents, etc.	
<b>Extended Families</b>	The members of a family in addition to parents and children, including the grandparents, aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews and cousins.	
<b>Hereditary</b>	A gene or tradition passed down through generations	
<b>Hoyaneh</b>	The male leaders of each nation of the Iroquois Confederacy	
<b>Longhouse</b>	Large, open dwellings (homes) where many families of the same Iroquois clan lived together	

<b>Matrilineal</b>	<b>Tracing your descent through the mother's line</b>	
<b>Nations</b>	<b>A community of people occupying and possessing a defined territory and united under one government</b>	
<b>Negotiate</b>	<b>To work out; talk over and arrange terms</b>	
<b>Principles</b>	<b>A fact or belief on which other ideas are based</b>	
<b>Society</b>	<b>All the people of any particular time or place; their activities and customs</b>	

<b>Treaty</b>	A formal agreement signed by the Canadian government and First Nations people	
<b>Two Row Wampum Treaty</b>	A treaty negotiated between the Iroquois Confederacy and people of European descent, based on mutual respect	
<b>Values</b>	The established ideas of life	
<b>Wampum</b>	Records of important events, ideas, contracts, pledges or treaties among nations, made by weaving specific patterns of shell beads into strings or belts
